One way to essentially increase food production is by eliminating food waste. OHA can help existing programs to eliminating food waste. These are some of the obstacles to homeownership and solutions of how OHA can help overcome them:

- 1) Land- having land available through DHHL or Kuleana Land Tax Exempt program knocks off a major cost. OHA as an advocate can create more partnerships like we've done with DLNR in Kalapana to obtain leases in areas not served by DHHL.
- 2) Labor- Many ohana can supply the labor through self-help projects. We must make use of our skilled Hawaiian tradesmen.
- 3) Materials- we could coordinate bulk purchases to reduce cost and stock recycled building materials for use in the construction.
- 4) Loans- right now interest rates are low and there already existing loan assistance programs that many people are not aware of.
